

## 2020-21 Re-Opening School Plan

### Hazel M. Kellington School



As we prepare to re-open schools on September 8, 2020 in Beautiful Plains School Division, we continue to prioritize the safety, health and well-being of our communities by doing our part to reduce the spread of COVID-19. With the advice from our Chief Medical Officer and Manitoba Education, Hazel M. Kellington School is planning to maximize health and mitigate risk proportionate to the level of COVID-19 infection determined by Manitoba Health.

As we continue to live in an unprecedented time with the pandemic, this plan assists in navigating responses to possible questions for the upcoming school year. **All levels support continued learning for students in BPSD for the 2020-21 academic school year.** Our school plan provides some specific details regarding the school day structure. For additional information on practices, such as cleaning protocols, helpful definitions (ex. physical distancing, cohorts, blended learning), and the BPSD screening tool, you can refer to our [BPSD Restoring Safe Schools](#) document found on our [divisional website](#).

*On July 30, 2020, the [provincial announcement](#) indicated that level 1 will be followed based on MB public health guidelines for September. Announcements regarding any changes to levels will be posted on the BPSD website.*

*On August 20, 2020 the province announced that Prairie Mountain Health had been moved into the “Orange – Restricted” category. This announcement was further clarified on August 21, stating that education was remaining in the “Yellow – Caution” level. This means that as of August 24, we are continuing to plan for a Level 1 school reopening, as per the guidelines below.*

## Welcoming Our Students Back

We are excited to welcome our Cubs back into school in September. We understand how important it is to allow children the opportunity to learn together with their friends, and are planning with this in mind as we develop protocols that will help to minimize the risk of infection for students and staff. We understand that some students, parents, and staff may be very anxious about coming into the school and being around other people. This is a normal reaction, and we will be working to help alleviate any fears that people might have. To help alleviate anxieties, we are going to use the first two scheduled days of school – September 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> - to stagger students' entry into school. We will have approximately half of our students come on September 8<sup>th</sup>, with the other students coming on September 9<sup>th</sup>. This will allow teachers and students smaller numbers on those first two days which will allow more one on one time to welcome kids into the school, review the new protocols that will be in place, and answer any questions that kids might have. Students whose last name starts with the letters A through L will attend school on Sept 8<sup>th</sup> (and not come to school Sept 9<sup>th</sup>), while students whose last name starts with the letters M through Z will have their first day of school on September 9<sup>th</sup> (and will not attend school on Sept 8<sup>th</sup>).

On September 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, teachers will be out on the playground (by 8:35 am) to meet their students. We will have lots of staff outside helping to direct kids to the proper spot, and are asking that parents drop kids off by one of the entrance gates just outside the playground. We understand that having parents stay outside the fence will be difficult for some, but want to do all we can to keep our children as safe as possible! Minimizing the number of people on our playground will provide the most space possible for distancing. We thank you in advance for your understanding and willingness to do your part to keep kids as safe as possible! Students in grades 1 and 2 (other than Mrs. Papegnies' grade 2 students) will meet their teachers on the north playground, while students in grades 3 and 4 will meet their teacher on the south playground. Mrs. Papegnies grade 2 students will go to the south playground, near Mrs. Papegnies classroom. For students coming on the bus, we will have staff on 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue greetings students as they get off the bus, and directing them as needed (grade 1 will go in the bus doors on 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave where an adult will take them out to meet their teacher on the playground; kindergarten and grade 2 will proceed to the north playground; and grades 3 and 4 will proceed to the south playground). Once students have arrived, teachers will talk with them about some of the new procedures, then will take them into the school – keeping proper physical distancing in mind – to start their first day! We hope that by bringing in smaller numbers on the first two days, and having teachers meet kids outside, that we will be able to make the transition into the new school year as smooth as possible!

Although there will be some anxieties regarding the start of the school year, there will also be much excitement as students and teachers have the opportunity to learn together, in person, for the first time in several months! We are excited, and are busy planning so that the school year will be as safe as possible!

In the pages that follow, we outline the plan as it is at this time. Please recognize that as new information and announcements are made by Manitoba Public Health, or Manitoba Education, that we will be adjusting this plan in order to keep in line with the Manitoba protocols. It is worth noting that although there are many sources of information available to people, we are taking our advice exclusively from Manitoba Health, Manitoba Education, and Beautiful Plains School Division.

The goal of HMK is to – as safely as possible - welcome children into the school, help them to work through any anxieties or fears they may have about being in school, and provide a solid academic base in the fundamental outcomes at their grade level. It will only be with parental

support, and communication between school and home, that we will be able to help our children feel as safe as possible, which will allow them the opportunity to maximize their learning!

Before getting into the specific details of our plan, we would like to highlight a few things that we know are going to be different from past years:

- **Meet the Teacher Night**
  - Unfortunately, we will not be able to have parents bring children into the school for “Meet the Teacher” the night before school starts. This year we need to alter our plan, and instead will have information and pictures of classrooms available for students and parents to see (either on the school website or through the communication platform they will be using with parents through the year).
- **The first two days of school, Sept 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>**
  - On our first two days of school we will have approximately half of the students come on Sept 8<sup>th</sup>, while the other half will come on Sept 9<sup>th</sup>.
  - **September 8<sup>th</sup>**: students whose last name starts with the letters A through L (only) attend school.
  - **September 9<sup>th</sup>**: students whose last name starts with the letters M through Z (only) attend school.
- **Access to the school**
  - The provincial document states that visitors to the school “should be minimized to the greatest extent possible.” In order to minimize the number of people coming into the school, the outside doors will be locked throughout the day. If you need to pick up your child early, or drop something off for them, please call the school and a staff member will meet you outside. We apologize in advance for this, as we know it will be an inconvenience for parents as you will no longer be able to simply drop into the school.
- **Kindergarten meetings scheduled for September 8<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup>**
  - With school not being open to visitors, kindergarten meetings scheduled for September 8<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> will take place outside on the north playground. If it happens to look like rain, we will either arrange for tents to be set up, or will meet at a different location.
- **Communication with parents**
  - Each classroom teacher will decide on the electronic communication platform they will be using with their class. Some examples of electronic communication platforms include Class DoJo, Remind, Facebook, Seesaw, and email. Some classes will also choose to supplement home-school communication with agenda books going back and forth.  
When the school needs to get a message out to the entire school population, we will email parents using the email addresses that we have on file. For this reason, **it is extremely important that we have your preferred email addresses on file.**
- **Terry Fox Day**
  - We will continue to learn about Terry Fox, but will not have a school wide celebration and hot dog BBQ this year.
- **Class lists**
  - Please note that as provincial announcements are made, we may need to change class lists on short notice. We will let parents know immediately if this needs to happen. Thank you in advance for your understanding.

- **Masks**
  - Students in grades 4 – 12, as well as all staff, will need to wear non-medical masks in common areas throughout the school and when physical distancing of 2 m is not possible. Students in kindergarten through grade 3 who can wear their masks independently are also encouraged to wear masks in school.
  - **September update:** ALL students are now required to wear a mask when travelling on a school bus. This includes students in kindergarten through grade 3.

### Requirements for Student/Staff Attendance

Students and staff must be in good health to attend school. Designated entries and exits will be used for each grade/class (these can be found on pages 6 and 7; or [see map here](#)). Before leaving for school each day, parents need to use the BPSD MB Covid-19 Screening Tool ([English](#); [Tagalog](#)) using the following guidelines:

- If a student (or staff member) shows any symptoms, they must stay home.
- Students are expected to notify the teacher if they are feeling ill while at school; for students who start showing any symptoms at school, parents will be contacted and students will need to go home.
- Students need to remain at home until there are no symptoms and they have been advised it is safe to return.
- Staff will be greeting students at the door for classroom entry to screen for any visible physical symptoms.
- Students/staff must self-isolate for 14 days if they have travelled outside MB excluding western Canada, the Territories or Ontario west of Terrance Bay. Please contact the school to indicate the reason for any absence.
- Students will need to stay in their assigned area unless directed otherwise by staff.
- Bring a lunch that does not require preparation at school (no microwave use); bring a water bottle with the child's name labelled on it.

### Reporting and Contact Tracing for Covid-19

If a person in the household has been diagnosed with COVID-19, they are required to consult [Health Links](#) prior to attending and follow their directions. In the event a student or household member reports that they have received a positive test for COVID-19:

- The parent/guardian will immediately advise the school principal, who will then notify the superintendent.
- To facilitate contact tracing, we record attendance regularly and accurately. This includes maintaining a daily log of all visitors and itinerant staff who access the building.
- As required by Public Health, we will provide contact information for other students or staff who are "close contacts" of the individual receiving the positive test result.
- Public Health officials will communicate with close contacts and advise the wider school community. As a school, we are not permitted to communicate this information without specific direction from public health officials.

- Contact tracing involves identifying the contacts of a positive case and contacting those individuals who may have been exposed.
- Public Health will identify cohorts/groups of staff, students, volunteers, and visitors in the school for a specified timeframe and contact students, staff, and families if they have been in close contact with a confirmed/probable case to determine whether they need to self-isolate or self-monitor and when they can return to school.
- Public Health will recommend testing to staff, students, volunteers, and visitors who may have been exposed to a positive case and assess the need for the school to be closed for a period of time.
- We will clean and disinfect areas where exposures took place; these areas will not be used until they are determined to be safe.
- If there is an outbreak at a school, this will be announced through Manitoba media bulletins and public health will provide instructions to those who have been in close contact.

### **Personal Hygiene and Respiratory Etiquette**

Please help us teach our children about proper hygiene and respiratory etiquette. You can do this at home:

- MB Public Health requires masks as an additional layer of protection for staff and all students in grades 4-12. **On the bus, all students – including students in kindergarten through grade 3 – are required to wear a mask.** In school, mask use is encouraged for children in kindergarten through grade 3 if they are independent in doing so. Please continue to practice [proper mask wearing etiquette](#) at home, and ensure that reusable masks are cleaned daily.
- Remind children to use proper hand hygiene (either wash hands with soap and water or sanitize hands) regularly and especially:
  - After coughing or sneezing
  - Before and after eating
  - After toilet use
  - When hands are visibly dirty
- Ensure that whenever they cough or sneeze that they cover their mouth and nose with a tissue or do it into their sleeve. Immediately throw used tissues in the garbage and then wash hands or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Remind students to avoid touching their face (eyes, nose, mouth) with unwashed hands.
- We have hand sanitizer available at our entrances, in every classroom, and around the school. Please remind your child to use the sanitizer when entering and leaving the school and classroom.
- Students/staff presenting symptoms at school will be re-located to the isolation room which is in the back of the main office.

### **Cleaning protocols**

As per provincial guidelines, we will be increasing our frequency of cleaning, disinfecting, and sanitizing. All commonly touched surfaces (e.g. door knobs, light switches, electronic devices, chairs, desks, art supplies, toys, games, gym equipment) will be disinfecting at least twice daily.

## Bus Transportation

Students eligible for regular bus transportation will continue to be provided service. Buses are considered cohorts for MB Health tracing. Parents must screen students prior to getting on the bus everyday. All students in kindergarten through 12 must wear masks to board the bus and for the entirety of the bus ride each day. If your child does not have a mask one will be provided for them. Please note that to help minimize contact between students that *bus passes will not be available* until further notice.

## Student Well-Being

Student and staff well-being is a priority for us as we navigate through this pandemic together. If you have any concerns regarding your child, please contact the school and we will work with your family to provide the resources and assistance as best we can. ## Additional Information

There have been some questions regarding remote learning, and whether or not parents can request remote learning for their child. The following excerpt is taken from page 8 of the province's "[Parent/Guardian and Educator Frequently Asked Questions](#)" document:

**If parents are uncomfortable with the risk of having their children resume classroom learning, do they have the option of asking for virtual learning opportunities or extra tutoring resources?**

- Virtual learning is not an option. Ensuring the safety, health, and well-being of all students, staff, and families has been a guiding principle in our planning, and public health has determined that it is safe to resume in-class learning while following public health guidance. This includes screening, enhanced hand hygiene, physical distancing, wearing a mask, the use of cohorts, and outbreak management, which are paramount in keeping as many students as possible in schools this fall and throughout the pandemic.
- Division-level remote learning will be in place for students who are medically advised not to return to in-class learning due to COVID-related risk factors.
- School staff and administrators will continue to support students in their return to in-class learning. Mental health and well-being are critical factors in returning to inclass learning plans. As such, regular check-ins and informal assessments will play an important role in supporting transitions.
- In Manitoba, parents or guardians may choose to homeschool their children. The Homeschooling Office within the Independent Education Unit of Manitoba Education administers homeschools and supports homeschooling families throughout the province. When parents choose to homeschool their child, they are responsible for obtaining resources and materials for the program of study. Provincial funding is not available to families who homeschool.

If you would like your child to enter or re-enter the school system, principals of public and funded independent K–12 schools are responsible for making grade-level placement decisions and for granting possible credits.

Please note that children must be registered in school – either a public school, private school, or home schooling. This is the law in Manitoba. If you are considering not sending your child to school, or if you have any questions, please contact the school at 204-476-2323.

Some of our classes will be using boot racks, providing they are able to maintain physical distancing in doing so. When children enter the school they will take their outdoor shoes off on the mat and take them either to their assigned boot rack, or to the classroom, depending on their class protocol. If a class is not using boot racks, teachers will have designated spaces in the classroom for children's outdoor footwear.

Each teacher will decide whether or not they want their students to use the coat hook areas, or have students keep outerwear at their desks. If coat hook areas are being used in a classroom, the teacher will put procedures in place so that students will have at least 1 m of distance when getting their coats, or hanging them up.

**Arrival**

- To help with distancing outside before school starts, as **town** students arrive (**but not before 8:35**), they will come directly into the school and proceed to their classrooms. **As bus students exit their bus, they will proceed to their assigned doors and enter directly into the school.** Classes will start for all students at 8:55.
- **Please ensure that children are not coming to school before 8:35.** For town students, arriving between 8:45 and 8:50 is ideal.
- When dropping your child off at school, and picking them up at the end of the day, please be sure to maintain a minimum physical distance of 2 m. If you cannot maintain a distance of 2 m, **please wear a mask.**
- If you are dropping your child off at the beginning of the day, please have them enter the school using the appropriate door according to the chart below (or [see the map on our website](#)).
- Please note that the play structures and swings will be closed before and after school to help minimize contact between children in different cohorts.
